1. Differentiated Instruction: Differentiated Instruction is a teaching practice that recognizes and responds to individual differences in students' readiness, interests, and learning profiles. It involves tailoring instruction to meet the needs of each learner, ensuring that all students have the opportunity to learn and succeed. This approach is based on the understanding that students learn at different rates and in different ways, and that a one-size-fits-all approach is ineffective. Differentiated instruction allows teachers to provide personalized learning experiences that challenge students and promote their growth.

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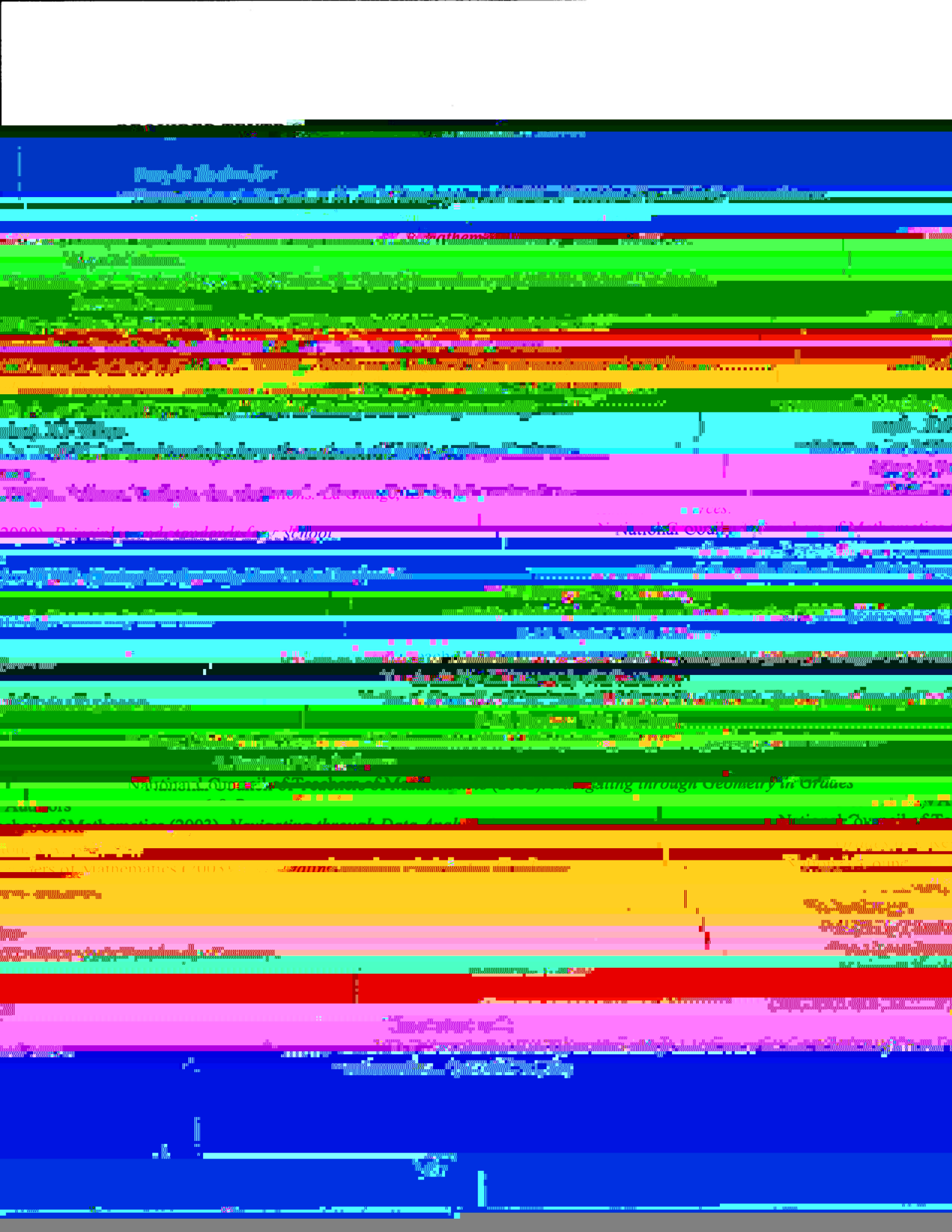

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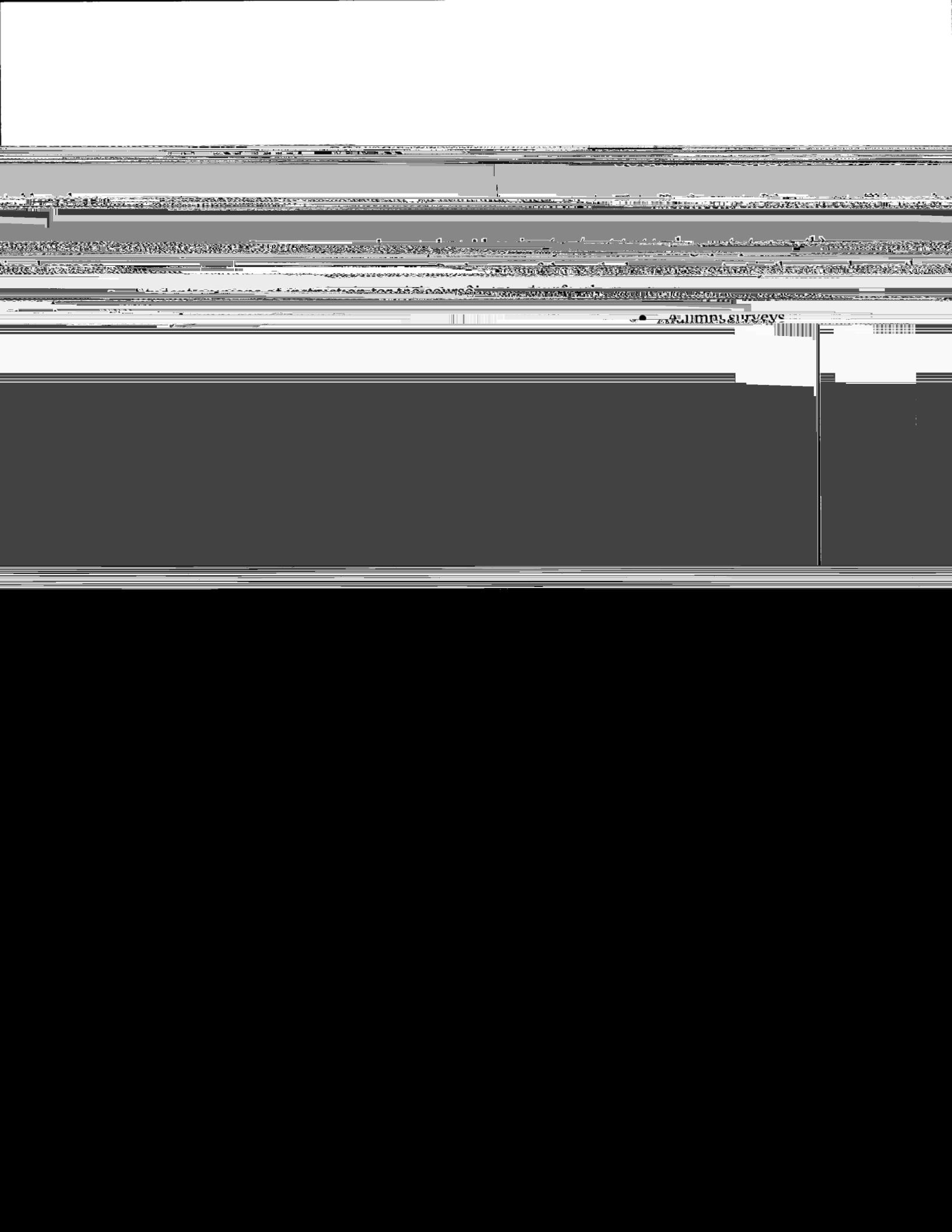
